**Bradley A. Kaufman**, one of the nation's pre-eminent transactional real estate attorneys specializing in retail and office leasing, has rejoined **Pryor Cashman** after an 11-year hiatus, bolstering the firm's already prestigious real estate practice.

Kaufman brings to Pryor Cashman his roster of name-brand national and international retail tenants, as well as prominent regional owners and developers of retail, office and industrial property.



Kaufman, who left Pryor Cashman in 1996, comes from the New York City office of Lowenstein Sandler and brings with him Andrea R. Gendel, who will be of counsel to Pryor Cashman.
